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Promoting Decent Work In India

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Introduction

To minimize the impact of the pandemic on the world of work, ILO constituents reviewed India Decent Work Country Programme (DWCP) 2018-22 – a five year overarching tripartite strategy to achieve ‘Decent work for All’. Read on this report to see the updates on key activities and achievements for the same for the period of February – April 2021.



Key Highlights

- A video series was developed by ILO’s occupational safety & health experts to promote safety measures for preventing the spread of Covid-19 at workplace.
- On 11th March 2021, an annual review meeting of India DWCP was held to plan the way forward for 2021
- Research Briefs undertaken:
 - (i) Employment, Labor Force and the Working Population in India 2000-2019
 - (ii) Young people not in employment and education in India: 2000-2019
- The SDG Target 8.7 Platform, convened by the ILO, inducted ‘Prayas JAC Society’ as a new member.
- An MSME helpdesk was launched by All India Organization of Employers and FICCI in collaboration with ILO
- Over 500 women were capacitated through Start and Improve your Business training in collaboration with Kudumbashree scheme of Government of Kerala.
- Policy recommendations were shared with the Ministry of Women & Child Development’s Mission Shakti, aimed at protection of women and their empowerment.
- In collaboration with AIOE, a study has been initiated on ‘New ramifications on internal migration in India as a result of COVID-19: the Industry perspective’ focusing on the issues of manpower requirements in some States and reintegration of migrants.
- UN South Asia Forum 2021 on Business and Human Rights was jointly organized by ILO along with UNDP and UNWG.
